Report on the Programmes

Five faculty members have attended the **Pedagogy** training at Teaching and Learning Centre, IIT Madras from 19th to 21stdecember 2016. The various sessions in the three day training program were Learning Outcomes, Active Cooperative Learning, Learner Centered Approach and Assessment methods. The course was handled by eminent faculty members from IIT Madras and was designed to provide SKILL to the faculty for helping the students to improve their learning ability and was mainly focused on activity based rather than lectures.

The programme 'Research simulations and predictive analysis using open source tools' emphasized on various open source tools such as Scilab, network simulator, python latex and the importance of those tools to research scholars. It also gave an awareness and knowledge about various e-resources for self learning and international certifications. The programme was for 5 days, from 14th November 2016 to 18th November 2016. Mr.Gaurav Kumar, Managing director Magma research and consultancies, handled all the five days sessions. The lectures and study materials helps the participants to know more about open source tools for research simulations and predictive analysis.

The Faculty Development Program Entitled "Bigdata Analytics, Machine Learning and Could Computing" Organized by IHRD during period from 21st November 2016 to 25th November 2016 was commenced with a formal Inauguration Session by Mr. Gaurav Kumar, Managing Director, Magma Research and Consultancy Pvt. Ltd at IHRD Finishing School, Kaloor, Ernakulam. Mr. Gaurav Kumar was the resource person for all the 5 days. Penetration Testing and Network Analytics using Python, Web Scraping with Python, Data Analysis with Natural Language Tool

Kit(NLTK), familiarization to Open Source Data Mining Tools, Could Computing were the main topics covered. Discussion on Internet of Things in could computing scenario and discussion on WEKA-Waikato Environment for Knowledge Analysis were the other interesting sessions. At end of the FDP, there was a test on the topics covered through all the 5 days. MCQs were distributed and the first place holder was awarded a trophy.

Pedagogy on Accreditation, research and entrepreneurship at Port Blair by ESCI was from 21/11/2016 to 23/11/2016. Dr.D.N.Reddy, Director, ESCI, Hyderabad, who was the former vice chancellor of JNTU, Hyderabad and Chairman of Appellate Committee, NBA, inaugurated the function. Dr.D.N.Reddy, Prof. K Sreenivas Kumar, Professor of ECE, university college of Dr. A P Natarajan and Mr.Pingnagan P were the eminent engineering, JNTU, Kakinada, personalities who handled the sessions. Preparation of course and lesson plan in compliance with learning objectives and outcomes; research methodologies; skill development for youth to bridge the gap between education and employment; attributes of teacher, effective teaching and class room communication for comprehensive understanding; entrepreneurship development in students / Industry - Institute Interaction - Curriculum development and Project Planning were the topics covered. The Program was ended with a feedback analysis and certificate distribution. Overall the program was very useful in accreditation point of view.

The four days training programme on Computer Aided Geometric Modeling, organized by Mechanical Engg. Department, College Of Engineering Adoor was from 29/11/216 to 2/12/216. Basic commands in AutoCAD, Transformations in 2D and editing in 2D, Dimensioning and text editing, 2dimensional modeling, Basics of 3D commands and elements, Editing 3D elements, Basic 3D modeling and advanced 3D modeling were the sessions covered. The sessions were handled by Sri Joshy Joseph And Sri Sanjeev C, CE Poonjar; Sri Vijay Krishnan and Sri Pradosh A C,MEC Ernakulum; Sri Prakash N CE Chengannur; Sri Premnath G and Sri Baiju V, CE Karunagappally and Sri LakhanMurari and Sri Vishnu Vijay from Dept.of Civil Engineering NSS Engineering College Palakkad. There were total thirty five participants from different parts of Kerala and actually the programme was scheduled for five days from 28th Nov to 2nd Dec 2016. But due to harthal on 28th Nov it was rescheduled to four days from 29th Nov to 2nd Dec 2016. The content, course structure and classes all are very good and it was a practical oriented training programme. As a whole the programme was very informative and motivating one for participants.

The faculty development program on Auto cad -2D and 3D at Model finishing School, Kaloor was from 29/11/2016 to 03/12/2016. All the five days sessions were handled by Mr. Mohammed Sabeer,

Trainer and Consultant in Computer Aided Drafting and Design (CADD), the CAD/CAM centre of Cochin University of Science and Technology, Cochin. Introduction to CAD software used, Relevance of Auto CAD; Introduction to Auto CAD-Interface, Concept and Categorization of commands; Drawing and editing commands, continued Object selection methods and Methods to achieve precision; Productivity tools in Auto CAD, Concept and Application of Layers, properties pallete, Hatching; Concept and Application of Blocks, local & global blocks; Introduction to 3D space, Methods to generate 3D views, Concept of UCS, Create a sample 3D object and Auto CAD as post processing tools for Analysis, 3D Animation, PCB design were the topics discussed. The session helps the participants have a clear insight towards the topic. The practical sessions made the programme much more interesting.

The faculty development program on Hands Training in open source tools for kernel programming & Administration was from 5th to 9th December 2016 at Model Finishing School, Thiruvanathapuram. The program was inaugurated and started by Prof. Jyothi John, Principal, College of Engineering Chengannoor. He took sessions on the philosophy of Linux. The other resource persons were Mr. Bijumon T, Faculty, MEC; Dr. Sunil TT, College of Engineering Attingal; Mr. manoj, Tata ELXI; Mr. AhammedSiraj, Faculty, MEC; Mr. Deepak Ravi, Iit, Delhi.Philosophy of Linux, open source licensing & distribution, basic Linux commands, Shell programming Concepts, QT Programming, Running PHP on LAMP stack and kernal compilation and configuration were discussed. Over all the course was very useful. The content, course structure and classes all are very good.

The National Faculty Development Programme on Entrepreneurship from 5th to 17th Dec 2016 at Rajagiri School of Engineering and Technology was organized by Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India Ahmadabad. Vice Principal of Rajagiri School of Engineering and Technology inaugurated the training programme. Sri. Sivan Ambattu briefed the activities of the Entrepreneurship Development Institute. The sessions were handled by Sri. Sivan Ambattu, Faculty member, EDI, Ahmadabad; Sri V S Sukumaran, Faculty, EDI Ahmadabad; Sri. Sherin Sam Jose, Associate Professor & Coordinator, IEDC, Dept of Automobile Engineering, AmalJyothi college of Engineering, Kanjirappally; Sri Dr K C Chandrasekharan Nair, Secretary of INCITE TBI, Bangaluru, Author-The Startup Habit, Ex-CFO Technopark, Ex-MD & Registrar Technopark-TBI (KSUM), Thiruvananthapuram; Advocate Febin James, Legalities IP services, Trissur and Sri Biju Abraham, industries and commerce department, Kakkanad. The twelve day program covered the sessions on, tool to evaluate the preferred learning style of individuals, learning habits of entrepreneurs, entrepreneur competencies, the entry barriers to entrepreneurship, the concepts of

Risk management and competency requirement of business persons, the concept of concentration and power, the concepts of market survey and business plan development, the concepts of: IP, Patents, Trademarks, Geographical Indications, Copy right, Industrial Design, Trade Secrets, & Layout Design of ICs. Overall the program turn to be very effective for the participants. The participants mention that industrial visit to various factories at Edayar Industrial Area, Ernakulam and the experience sharing of the resource persons made the program much interesting.

The GIAN Course in Social network Theory and Analysis was held during 17-23 December 2016 at IIT Hyderabad. Course Coordinator was Prof M P Ganesh. The course instructor was Prof. IsrarQureshi is a Professor of Information Systems and Entrepreneurship at IE Business School, Spain. The course was started by sessions on six degrees separation, centrality measurements, network measurements, analysis of sociocentric and egocentric networks. There was a brief session on current research topics that is being handled by professor. Also UCINET tool was introduced and experiments was done during that session. On the second day topics such as critical mass theory, social capital, cognitive consistency, balance theory was handled. Afternoon session was on UCINET experiments. On the third day Inter organizational structure was discussed. System theory, complexity theory, Butterfly effect in social network was discussed in the class. On fourth day ecology formation was the topic handled by Prof Qureshi. Demographic process, ecological process, density dependence, environmental process technological process etc was discussed. On fifth day three three models of network analysis Relational model, experimental graph model, and stochastic actor oriented model was discussed. In the afternoon session experiments on group analysis with UCINET tool was done. On sixth day contagious, semantic and cognitive theories were taught. Rsiena tool was introduced in that day. Related to that cognitive social structure was also discussed. On Last day ERGM models and Stochastic actor oriented models were discussed. Attribute modeling was taught and the experiments on Rseina was done based on this topic. There was presentation by all participants on how they use the knowledge obtained. from the course on their current and future research. The program was concluded by session on research methodologies and paper writing on social network analysis.

Discussion: - Dr.Jayakumar, SPFU Directorpointed out that the project is ending by 31st March 2017 and hence any payment to be made should be done before that. He advised to expedite the payment to IEEE for publication of conference proceedings. The coordinators of the conference

informed the committee that IEEE Kerala section is contacting the IEEE Head office at US and the payment can only be made after obtaining concurrence from IEEE. Dr.V.P.Devassia enquired about the clarification received from SPFU about signing a 3 year contract with ICT Academy. SPFU, Director informed that if the amount involved is more than 1 lakh, the PMSS procedure is to be adopted and there is no other restriction in signing the contract.

Decision: BOG took note of the ATR and approved.

But Dr.Jayakumar clarified that the quotations having more than 25% above the budgeted amount should be cancelled.

Discussion:DrJayakumar expressed a little doubt regarding the completion of these much student training programmes during these two months. But he encouraged to conduct as many programs as possible as we have approximately 80 lakhs rupees remaining to be spent in the next 4 months.

Decision:

3.3 HIT PROGRAM ONRED HAT CERTIFIED SYSTEM ADMINISTRATOR TRAINING

The EAP cell of CE Cherthala is proposing a High Intensity Program on "Red Hat Certified System Administrator Training" which is to be initiated as a service on the procurement Management Support System. The coordinator for the above program is Ms.Greeshma N Gopal, Asst Prof in Computer Science and engineering. The terms of reference of the said proposal is attached as annexure II.

Discussion: The BOG has suggested that the payment is to be completed before 31st March 2017, which is the completion date of TEQIP –II and hence directed to change the ToR accordingly.

Decision:

- 1. The BOG approved the HIT program on RED HAT certified system administrator training.
- 2. The BOG directed to change the condition of payment in the ToR such that payment shall be completed before the completion of the project.

3.4 REIMBURSEMENT OF TUITION FEE OF PT Ph.D CANDIDATES

Discussion: SPFU Director, Dr.Jayakumar suggested that BOG should fix an upper limit for the amount that may be reimbursed. BOG observed that for those who have already registered, fee can be reimbursed as a motivation to continue their research. For new candidates the fee can bepaid and fee need not be reimbursed for those who are on deputation for full time research. It was also decided to reimburse the semester fee and other fees of candidates registered in recognized Universities of Kerala state.

Decision: The BOG decided to reimburse the course fee, tuition fee etc of faculty doing Ph.D, except those who are on deputation for Ph.D, during the period they have worked in the institution after signing MoU with the Government for implementation of TEQIP II.

3.5 Fixing the tentative date of the XIV BOG meeting

Discussion: TEQIP coordinator informed that since TEQIP started in 2013 we are to conduct 16 BOG meetings by March 2016. Dr.Jayakumar was of the opinion that it is better to conduct as many BOGs as prescribed by world bank. Hence it was decided that the college may conduct 3 BOGs in the next three months.

Decision:

The Tentative date for the next BOG meeting ison the second week of Jan-2017.

4 OTHER ITEMS WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE CHAIR

4.1 NAAC ACCREDITATION

Discussion: The Principal placed a proposal for presenting the college for NAAC accreditation. The principal informed the committee that any higher education institution is eligible to apply for NAAC accreditation if they have a record of at least two batches of students or been in existence for 6 years. A NAAC certificate is a must for all colleges to get funds from UGC and one of the basic requirement to be eligible for grants under RUSA, FIST,DST etc. The fee for accreditation is Rs.3,00,000/- plus service tax as applicable from time to time for upto 10 departments in Universities and professional institutions.

SPFU Director opined that now RUSA funding is limited to Arts &Science colleges only. But it is advantageous for the college to get NAAC accreditation. He also opined that if the college is going for NAAC accreditation it is better to go for ISO certification also. The committee agreed to this.

Decision:

- 1. The BOG decided to apply for NAAC accreditation.
- 2. The BOG decided to go for ISO Certification.
- 3. The BOG directed the TEQIP cell to identify an agency for ISO certification through PMSS.

4.2 PROGRESS DUE TO TEQIP – PRESENTATION by HODs

Mr.Jayadas C. K, HOD of Electronics and communication, Dr. Preetha Teresa Joy, HOD of Computer Science and Engineering and Ms.ElizwaLaiju, HOD of Electrical and Electronics Engineering presented a brief report on the effectiveness and achievement of TEQIP-II in the respective departments.

Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme-Phase-II

1. BACKGROUND

The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India in the year 2002 conceived and designed the Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme (TEQIP) as a long term programme for implementation in 2 to 3 phases over a duration of 10-12 years for systemic transformation of the technical education system. TEQIP Phase–I commenced in March 2003 and was successfully completed in March, 2009, covering 127 institutions. Encouraged by the highly significant achievements of Phase-I of the Programme, the Government of India has decided to implement Phase-II of the Programme through MHRD. One key component of the Phase-II Project is **Implementation of Institutional reforms**. Accreditation of eligible UG & PG programs is one of the key performance indicators of this project.

Accreditation of programs is one of the quality assurance mechanisms. The accreditation target to be achieved by the end of the Second Project-Year is 60% of the eligible UG and PG programs (obtained and applied for) and 100% accreditation (obtained and applied) for the eligible UG and PG programs by the end of the Project. Institutions need to take appropriate actions to obtain accreditation of eligible PG and UG programs within the specified timeframe and also for renewal of accreditation during the Project period.

Development of processes and implementation of quality management system in line with ISO 9001:2015 will help the institution for accreditation process as wells as establishment of quality system in the institution.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

- 1. Awareness training programs to faculty and supporting staff members, 2 or 3 batches with around 25 members.
- 2. Documentation support for preparation of the quality manual, procedures and formats.

- 3. Technical support for implementation.
- 4. Internal auditor training for around 25 members.
- 5. Minimum 2 internal audit support.
- 6. Follow up support after internal audit.
- 7. Follow up support after external audit.
- 8. 18 months support from the date of commencement of the project.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND CAPABILITY OF TRAINING PROVIDERS

The training provider should meet the following benchmarks:

- i. The organization's annual turnover should not be less than Rs.100000/- per annum during each of the last three years.
- ii. The organization should have minimum 3 regular employees working on.
- iii. The organization should have completed at least three projects of similar nature in past five years.
- iv. The organization should have relevant experience in geographical region.

4. EVALUATION & SELECTION

The selection of agencies will be on the basis of procurement norms of TEQIP II, Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS).

The RFP shall request the eligible consultants to provide their best technical and financial proposals in separate envelopes. Selection will be based on a combined evaluation of technical proposal and financial proposal. The total score shall be obtained by weighing the quality and cost scores and adding them. The firm obtaining highest total score shall be invited for the negotiations. Technical evaluation will be by a pointing system, where weightage is given for different parameters. The parameters are given below.
